Tent covers clean-up site

A GIANT tent has been erected over the site of a former gasworks in Hull as part of a major environmental improvement programme.

The 17 hectare site in Clough Road began life as a gasworks in 1824, and until its closure in the early 1970s produced much of the city's gas by large-scale coal gasification, a process which became obsolete with the arrival of natural gas from the North Sea and Morecambe Bay.

But the work left the site with a legacy of polluted earth which owner National Grid is attempting to clean up. More than 62,000 tons of material are being treated through a process of bioremediation, which will see naturally-occurring microbes already in the soil stimulated to break down deposits.
